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Dear Mr Sohlman,

I wish to draw your attention to a remarkable letter from some 37 scientists, biologists and other professionals, including many whose opinions are of great weight, that was received by the esteemed *Science* journal last week, a copy of which is attached to this email.

My letter to you is supported by the Board of the International Semmelweis Organisation, a group of considerable prestige that shares the concerns expressed by the signatories of the above letter. The Semmelweis Board resolution of support is available [here](#).

This matter relates to your award of the Nobel Laureate to Professor Luc Montagnier and Dr. Françoise Barré-Sinoussi. Although they are both well-reputed scientists, there is a problem in this matter of the discovery of HIV. It seems that the claim that this virus is the cause of AIDS rests on the veracity and integrity of an experiment carried out in March 1984 in the laboratory of Dr Robert Gallo at the US National Cancer Laboratory in which Montagnier and Barré-Sinoussi virus was used and after which it was claimed for the first time that this virus had been established to be the cause of AIDS.

Recent evidence has come to light that originated from Dr Gallo's laboratory of that time. The letter's signatories have examined this evidence and conclude that at no point during this same experiment was there any attempt to prove a virus the cause of AIDS.

How this extraordinary situation came about is explained in the letter to *Science*. Briefly, firm evidence of scientific fraud has been unearthed. This is why we are most urgently addressing this to your attention.

My role in this is that of a writer on medical matters. It was during the research for my recent book "*Fear of the Invisible*" that I came across this previously unreported documentary evidence and drew it to the attention of the signatories of this letter and the Semmelweis.
